We also celebrate a special **choral service of Holy Eucharist** at our 11 a.m. service, which is accompanied by an ensemble of strings and woodwinds and guest organist Bruce Stevens. Reaching out. Outreach within St. Mary's, the surrounding community, and beyond is a testament to the vibrant life of our parish. Upcoming outreach opportunities with some of our outreach partners include:

- ❖ **Thanksgiving meals** to families served by **Goochland Free Clinic and Family Services**: Small Saints and Junior Youth Group (St. Mary's children in kindergarten through grade 5) have decorated bags to fill with food for a Thanksgiving meal for a family who might otherwise not have one. If you haven't already done so, please pick up a bag with a list of food needs as you leave this morning's service and return it to St. Mary's by **next Sunday, November 8**.
- ❖ **Christmas giving** to families served by the **Goochland Christmas Mother and Goochland Free Clinic and Family Services**: Small Saints and Junior Youth Group (St. Mary's children in kindergarten through grade 5) will decorate ornaments with suggestions for Christmas presents for children who might otherwise not receive any, as well as other household items needed. The ornaments will hang on the Giving Tree in the New Parish Hall. Please plan to take an ornament, and return presents by **Sunday, December 13**.
- ❖ American Red Cross **Blood drive**: St. Mary's parishioners (age 16 and up) have the opportunity to donate blood at St. Mary's from 8 a.m. to 2 p.m. on **Sunday, December 13**. Every two seconds, someone needs blood, and Red Cross is the supplier of blood and blood products to all major hospitals in the Richmond area. One of our own St. Mary's parishioners currently receives multiple transfusions as he fights childhood leukemia. Please stay tuned for more information and plan to donate on December 13.
- ❖ Quarters for **CARITAS**: CARITAS offers basic housing, necessities, food, and support to people who have lost their homes through a network of partner congregations, including St. Mary's. We will host CARITAS January 30-February 6, and we will provide **clean laundry** for our guest each day. Please donate quarters for the laundry in the "**Quarters for CARITAS**" jar in the Café between the kitchen and the New Parish Hall.
