A WEEKLY REFLECTION

World Mission Sunday holds a special place in my heart. Without world mission through the Episcopal Church, I most likely wouldn't be working at St. Mary's. Since my first mission trip to Liberia, Africa where I met Buck Blanchard, I've learned the importance of living fully into our Baptismal Covenant, "to seek and serve Christ in all persons."

Because when you engage in world mission, you are not going to simply give. You are going to encounter your brothers and sisters in Christ throughout the Anglican Communion. From Liberia to Cuba, to the Dominican Republic, Honduras, Hong Kong, the Philippines, El Salvador, and Ecuador, time and time again I've been graciously received and have developed life-changing relationships.

Last week, I had the privilege to travel to Quito, Ecuador with Chris Retrievi, a parishioner of St. Mary's, and eight others from the Southeast to explore possible mission opportunities. In one of the nightly debriefs all of us were reminded that we are not here to simply give our money, knowledge, skills, or to "do something" for the communities. We were there to enter into a reciprocal relationship. The communities we meet may not be rich financially but they are rich in hospitality, joy, and spiritual understanding. We each offer something different, but as God's children we all have something to offer. If we refuse to receive than we are robbing someone of the blessing of giving.

Now, we all may not be able to travel around the world to serve Christ in all persons. But there's another part of our Baptismal Covenant that applies here – "to respect the dignity of every human being." Time and time again we hear the message of love – God's love. That's what connects each and every one of us, remembering that we are created in God's image. World Mission Sunday is an opportunity and a reminder to recognize that we are all made of the same blood and of the same flesh.

So whether it's flying across the globe to celebrate the Eucharist at an Episcopal Church in Africa or writing a check to support typhoon relief in the Philippines or welcoming a refugee family to your local community, we all share our love with our brothers and sisters in this global family called the Anglican Communion.

WORLD MISSION SUNDAY IS TODAY!

The Episcopal Church recognizes the **Last Sunday after the Epiphany as World Mission Sunday**. World Mission Sunday focuses on the global impact of the Baptismal Covenant's call to "seek and serve Christ in all persons" (Book of Common Prayer, p. 305), and to **raise awareness of the many ways in which the Episcopal Church participates in God's mission around the world.**

Today, **Buck Blanchard**, Director of Mission and Outreach at the Episcopal Diocese of Virginia, preaches about the amazing opportunities we have to **engage in relationships with our brothers and sisters in Christ around the world**.

Brown says, "We cultivate love when we allow our most vulnerable and powerful selves to be deeply seen and known, and when we honor the spiritual connection that grows from that offering with trust, respect, kindness and affection." The book study will meet at 10 a.m. in the Library each Sunday in March.
