A WEEKLY REFLECTION

When this perishable body puts on imperishability, and this mortal body puts on immortality, then the saying that is written will be fulfilled:

"Death has been swallowed up in victory."

⁵⁵ *"Where, O death, is your victory?"*

Where, O death, is your sting?"

1 Corinthians 15:54-55

One of my favorite parts of the Easter Service is the Flowering of the Cross. After the acolytes, choir, children's choir, lay Eucharistic ministers, and clergy process, the music continues as the children walk up to the cross in front of the altar. There, with the help of several patient parents, the children cover the cross with fresh blooming flowers.

At first glance, this is beautiful. Just plain beautiful. There are the kids, the flowers, the sunlight pouring in, and the general joy of Easter, particularly this year when the weather was so beautiful.

Beyond the surface, the flowering of the cross creates a picture of deep symbolic beauty. It is new life bursting forth out of death. That is what the celebration of Easter is all about. We celebrate the risen Christ conquering death and overcoming the power of the grave! And in my mind, there is no better picture of this than the flowers on the cross. The cross is an instrument of torture and death, but blooming flowers are new life in all its beauty.

This Easter Season, I'm going to meditate on the flowered cross; on life bursting forth out of death; on light bursting forth out of darkness; on love bursting forth out of hate.

Because that is the focus of the Resurrection and the Easter season.

ORDER OF ST. JOHN

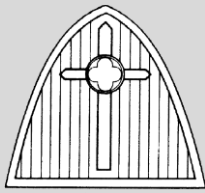
