"BEYOND BRIDGES" ART EXHIBITION

From October 1-November 12, St. Mary's will host "Beyond Bridges," a traveling exhibition featuring **21 works of premier Christian, Muslim, and Jewish contemporary artists**. The exhibition is organized by CARAVAN, a peacebuilding arts nonprofit led by The Reverend Canon Paul-Gordon Chandler. As it says on the organization's website, "It is more critical than ever that '**creative bridges of dialogue**' be built enabling us to walk across to meet our neighbor on the other side...The ultimate objective of the exhibition is for it to serve as an 'encounter point,' **encouraging and enabling new relationships to be made across religions and cultures.**"

We invite all St. Mary's parishioners and community members to come hear **Paul-Gordon preach next Sunday, October 1 at the 9 and 11 a.m. services** and join him during **Adult Forum at 10 a.m. for a discussion** of his new book, *In Search of a Prophet: A Spiritual Journey with Kahlil Gibran* (pick up a copy in the Café). During adult forum, he will take listeners on a fascinating journey through the all-embracing spirituality of Kahlil Gibran, the early 20th century Lebanese-American poet, artist, and mystic. Paul-Gordon explores how Kahlil Gibran, a supreme East-West figure, can be a much-needed guide in the midst of today's global challenges related to peace, harmony, and building bridges between the creeds of the Middle East and West.

SPIRITUAL FORMATION AND ADULT EDUCATION

Join us in Adult Forum this morning at 10 a.m. in the New Parish Hall to kickoff our **Stewardship Annual Giving Campaign, "A Gift Opens the Way"**. The **men's spiritual practice group** meets weekly at **7:30 a.m.** in the Old Parish Hall. **Continuing this Tuesday, September 19 through Tuesday, October 10**, this gathering is an opportunity to deepen faith and is open to men of all ages.

Faith and Film series: Where do we see our lives reflected in film? How can we understand our faith through the lens of popular culture? Join Andrew Moore on **Wednesday evenings in October at 6:30 p.m.** for a movie and discussion. This fall we'll be watching *Hacksaw Ridge* on October 4, *A Man for All Seasons* on October 11, *Inside Out* on October 18, and *Groundhog Day* on October 25. Feel free to bring your dinner to enjoy during the film. Popcorn will be provided.

Join Tracey Harvey on Sunday mornings at 10 a.m. in October in the Library as she leads a **book study using Brené Brown's book *Rising Strong***, and her audio book *Rising Strong as a Spiritual Practice*. Brown offers an in-depth exploration of this critical and oft-misunderstood aspect of wholehearted living. Here she defines spirituality as something not reliant on religion, theology, or dogma - rather, it is a belief in our interconnectedness and in a loving force greater than ourselves. Whether you access the sacred through traditional worship, solitary meditation, communion with nature, or creative pursuits, one thing is clear: **Rising strong after falling is a spiritual practice** that brings a sense of perspective, meaning, and purpose to our lives.

PARISH LIFE

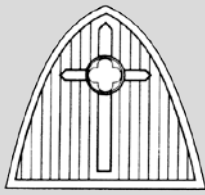
