### A WEEKLY REFLECTION

### "God is Love." - 1 John 4:16

"We believe and testify that God loves each of us boundlessly, just as we are. When we know ourselves to be loved deeply and unconditionally, we can love others with that same love that has been given so generously to us" (SSIE).

Congregations Around Richmond Involved to Assure Shelter—an appropriate acronym for "caritas," or Christian love of humankind, charity. CARITAS's presence this past week has surely impacted the lives of all in our St. Mary's community. Perhaps making a meaningful difference in the lives of these vulnerable families has given us perspective on our challenges and blessings, and with impeccable timing—enriching our faith life at the beginning of this season of Lent.

One of my favorite dinner blessings is "Give us grateful hearts, our Father, for all thy mercies, and make us ever mindful of the needs of others; through Jesus Christ our Lord, Amen."—a daily reminder that we have so much to be thankful for, AND there is so much need in and beyond our community. Reverend Bob gave a sermon last year on "Living Eucharistically." Delivered just before Communion, the close ties he drew between the Eucharist and our daily lives resounds each time we say our mealtime blessing. He reminded us of God's plan for each of us—taking hold of our lives with purpose. He asked that we give thanks for our own, unique gifts and talents; that we "break" into the lives of others and share these gifts; and that we give our lives away to "lean in" to life. In so doing, we will grow hopefully and joyfully in our faith.

This week with CARITAS, we "broke" into the lives of 12 parents, 10 children, 5 teens, and a soon-to-be mother of twins. Although 5:30 each evening was a whirlwind of activity, our guests felt our congregation's warm, welcoming hearts thanks to His love that binds us all together.

Thank you for your loving hands that unloaded and reloaded trucks, prepared and served meals, assembled lunches and gift bags, donated supplies, laundered and mended clothes, drove shower shuttles, spent time with guests, held and fed children, played games, washed dishes, blessed meals, stayed overnight, and to Seth Schaeffer, the CARITAS Committee, and those who have led this outreach mission for years. Thanks to all of you for being ever mindful of others' needs, and "leaning in."

There are many invitations throughout Lent for you to enrich your faith life here at St. Mary's. These offerings take place throughout the week, but Wednesday has by far the most opportunities. Read more below about how you and your family can take a mid-week break for self-examination, discernment, and collective spiritual renewal.

### **Worship Opportunities:**

- ❖ Noonday Prayer every Wednesday throughout the year is led by clergy and parishioners of St. Mary's at 12 p.m. in Little St. Mary's.
- ❖ Evening Prayer every Wednesday in Lent (February 21 and 28, March 7, 14, and 21) is led by clergy and parishioners of St. Mary's at 5:30 p.m. in Little St. Mary's. Join us for a brief reflective service before Lenten Supper.
- ❖ Stations of the Cross is Wednesday, March 28 at 5:30 p.m. This shadow play, performed by the Children's Choir and the youth of St. Mary's, is a beautiful production and a moving meditation on the crucifixion of Christ. Rehearsals for Stations of the Cross are on Wednesdays, March 7, 14, and 21.

#### Fellowship Opportunity:

**❖ Lenten Soup Suppers:** Gather for a simple supper every Wednesday throughout Lent (February 21 and 28, March 7, 14, and 21). **Serving begins at 5:30 p.m.** and is followed by programs for adults, children, and youth at 6:15 p.m. Suggested donation is \$8/person and \$22/family.

### Spiritual Formation Opportunities for Children, Youth, and Adults:

- Children's Program follows Lenten Supper at 6:15 p.m. Evenings together consist of fun games based on the Parables that coincide with the speaker series. It's a friendly competition with fun prizes each week!
- **❖ Following the Lenten Supper, youth** (grades 6-12) are invited for **a time of fun and fellowship** in the Education Building from 6:15 p.m. − 7:00 p.m.
- ❖ Lenten Speaker Series begins at 6:15 p.m. and focuses on some of the old and familiar parables. The Stories He'd Tell: Exploring the Parables of Jesus led by Thom Blair looks at ideas and implications in each parable that maybe haven't received too much attention. This first Wednesday, February 21, we'll look at "The man who learned the hard way," Luke 16:19-31.
