This Lent, I want to hold up before us the words of Jesus at the last meal he shared with his friends when he

said, 'Do this in remembrance of me.' I treasure the clarity of his words, 'Do this.' Think about it, yes. Talk about it, yes. Wonder at the mystery of it all, yes. But most of all, 'Do this.'

J esus was specifically talking about sharing a sacred meal and with one another, and being fed by his life to live a life like his. Perhaps his instructions to 'Do this' given at this last meal can be just the beginning of many kinds of 'do this' in remembrance of him. n preparing for Lent, some of us have been thinking about the ways that Jesus lived and naming some of the key characteristics of his life. We wondered, what would it be like if we applied Jesus's 'Do this' from the Last Supper to those key aspects of his life? For example, Jesus forgave. Shouldn't we 'Do this' – forgive – in remembrance of him? Jesus showed compassion. Shouldn't we 'Do this' – show compassion – in remembrance of him?
