This is what God feels like to me, and I move toward people and places that resonate with this feeling and away from what does not.

don't know what the wise men saw in the night sky that made them ride across a desert to pay homage to a child born in a stable. But I get that God can speak through stars. Think of God calling Abraham out to look at the night sky and promising him that he would have descendants as numerous as those stars. Abraham believed God, and it was reckoned to him as righteousness (Genesis 15:6). The beginning of the Jewish, Christian, and Islamic faiths can be traced back to that moment.

f you are reading this, I am pretty sure God has planted a homing signal in you, too. There is a star that is calling you. What is it? Where is it leading you?
