Somewhere back when I was in my mid to late 20s, I was trying to make my way back to church. Like a lot of people, I

stepped away from going to church when I left home for college. That time away from going to church was so important to me as I look back. I needed to find my own faith in God. Not my parents'. Not my grandparents'. Not anyone else's but my own.

ne of the first things I did in 'going back to church' was to attend a weeknight Lenten teaching series. It was at Holy Comforter over on Monument. The presenter for those weeknights was Clay Matthews

who later became Bishop Suffragan. He spent all those Lenten sessions looking at Psalm 139, a portion of which is the psalm appointed for this Sunday. I knew I'd heard it before. But I'd never really *heard* it before. "Lord... you know my sitting down and my rising up; You trace my journeys and my resting place..."

hen Clay read those words to us, I remember feeling like a great weight had been lifted off my shoulders. I believe that I thought beginnings were just clean breaks with the past probably because something had gone wrong. Similarly, I thought our endings were probably signs of failures. But God is in our beginnings and in our endings and

Not exactly a proper job description but one that made sense to us both.

This Sunday is Harrison's concluding Sunday with us as our Deacon Associate, a 'rising up' place for him for a new journey from here, and an ending place for us. And God is in this place of endings and new beginnings with blessings to give for what has been given and for what is to come. I hope you will take time this Sunday to hug his neck, remind him of what a gift he is, and send him forth with our love and God's peace. And give thanks to God who gives blessings in all of our endings and beginnings.
