n October Linda Rose, John Hyslop, and I went on a St. Mary's-supported "vision" trip to eight mission

sites in the three countries of Kenya, Rwanda, and Uganda. Our leader was Celeste Bundy, executive director of our outreach partner, Education Equals Hope. We called it a vision trip because we visited and saw each site rather than focusing on service in one or two. Our goal was to see what might be done and envision subsequent mission trips.

The theme of my reflection echoes last Sunday's sermon by Harrison Higgins based on the gospel of John 1:43-51, when Phillip recruited

Nathaniel to follow Jesus, with the words "Come and see." Let me share some of what we saw on this vision trip:

discovered that was not so much the case. We saw a widespread awareness and belief in God and His Kingdom in each mission site. During a home visit, I recall being so impressed with an art piece on the wall that read:

NAKUSHUKURO MUNGU KYA YOTE ULIONITENDEA

which translates from Swahili to

I THANK YOU GOD FOR ALL THAT YOU DO FOR ME

t every mission site we saw the children sing, dance, and recite poetry for us. Our ah-ha was in learning that one of our best gifts to them was to honor, respect, and enjoy their gifts to us in their presentations. I learned how important it was to them that we graciously acknowledge their music as true expressions of God's love. These were gifts that each of us will long remember and cherish.

e saw people collecting unclean water from streams and carrying it home on their heads. Clean water is perhaps their number-one health need. We went with the belief we might make a small difference by bringing water filters to those communities struggling with the ill effects of unclean water. We were totally on target with this mission element of our trip. People stood in line for the filters and were overjoyed by the distribution.

So, what's next? David, and our Outreach Committee, have been wonderful in encouraging us to answer this question. We know that St. Mary's has a call to do good things in the world. Our links to these three countries make the decision easy. We look forward to sharing and showing more of this story with you at the Adult Forum this Sunday, and continuing the discussion of how we can continue to do good work in the world. "Come and see."
