Christmas wreaths
to clients at
Gateway Homes
in Chesterfield,

2023's visit was the best yet. I would like to share some of Carol's and my impressions of the experience to give you some insight into our relationship with Gateway and to help you envision how the fruits of our creative efforts were received there.

ur St. Mary's outreach partner Gateway Homes provides a transitional residential treatment program for individuals with mental illness who are striving for independence. The 25 wreaths we delivered went to each of the 17

apartments on the campus and to one group home on that property, as well as their group home in Manakin Sabot, and two new youth homes.

Three staff members, Matt, Lisa, and Julie greeted us and helped us hang the wreaths in the gazebo. As clients left the activities building, the staffers encouraged them to "shop" for a wreath. All of them did so with enthusiasm, and each expressed appreciation for the church's kind gesture, and especially for the fact that church members had handmade the wreaths. It was clear that each person was choosing something meaningful to them. They don't have much, and gifts like these are rare in their lives.

Weekly reflection continues...

Att and Julie were especially helpful in taking us to the apartments of residents who had not already picked up a wreath. After we were introduced, we offered wreaths that were gladly accepted and immediately hung on their doors. We had not had such complete access to at-home residents on prior visits, so this was welcome growth in our relationship with Gateway Homes.

e also gave each client a Christmas card hand-drawn by our youth.

When we explained that these were from the children of our church,
each man and woman radiated pleasure and were clearly touched by the gift.

Several women responded to the children's efforts with an appreciative "aww!"

The highlight was the reaction of one client to one of Ann Steele's wreaths. Most clients there are in their 20s and 30s. This man looked to be in his 60s with white hair down to his shoulders. It was apparent that he'd had a hard life, possibly homeless at some point. He shuffled around the gazebo considering each wreath and eventually decided he wanted one of the woven grapevine wreaths. When I asked him how he had made his decision, he said "It makes me think of Jesus's crown of thorns."

ow! Reflect on that for a while. What an example of the impact we can and do make in these peoples' lives!
