t an Adult Forum in the fall of 2018, I led a discussion about conflict transformation.

I don't remember all the details, but I know that I made connections with the core Christian practice of reconciliation and the work of Christ's love to carry that out. The late Allen Ferguson raised his hand and asked, "How am I supposed to love everybody? Honestly, it's not even possible." I remember I didn't respond to his question very effectively, because, well, how do you love everybody?

Allison Dunaway's beautiful reflection last week finally gave

me at least one possible answer to Allen's question: you love everybody one person at a time, that's how. What she describes in her reflection are the effects of the ongoing conflict in our nation (and in our families) brought about by years of political polarization. It's the kind of thing that can make you lose heart or choose to become cynical.

But loss of heart or cynicism aren't the only alternatives. Allison described a different response: the One Step at a Time initiative of StoryCorps. This is a program that pairs people with different worldviews and experiences to have a facilitated conversation about their own lives. Richmond is one of four cities in the

I find that whenever that happens, the Spirit of God has some room in me to work.

That person is out there somewhere right now living their life. Our lives will intersect for a 45-minute conversation in late April. And then I realized, with a start, that the Spirit was, is, already at work.
